

Anyone interested in going to **One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest** at the Civic Theatre in January?





RECIPE

Oven-Roasted New Potato and Artichoke Salad

(4 servings)

By Jackie Mason

6 large new potatoes, scrubbed, cut into eighths

4 Tbls. olive oil (save out 1 Tbls. of oil)

1 Tbls. Kosher salt

1 Tbls. balsamic vinegar

2 Tbls. fresh lemon juice

1 Tbls. Dijon Mustard

1 Tbls. chopped fresh rosemary

½ Teas. Salt, or to taste

Fresh ground pepper to taste

1 6-oz jar marinated artichoke hearts, drained and cut in half

1 cup cherry tomatoes, halved

½ red onion, thinly sliced

3 green onions, chopped

4 strips of bacon, cooked crisp,

drained and crumbled (I use 6 strips)

½ cup shaved Parmesan cheese

Heat oven to 400 degrees. Toss together potatoes, 3 Tbls. oil and salt in baking pan. Bake, turning occasionally, until potatoes are tender; about 45 minutes. Place potatoes in a bowl and toss with vinegar. Set aside to cool.

Stir remaining oil, lemon juice, Dijon mustard, rosemary and salt and pepper in a small bowl; set aside.

Add artichokes, tomatoes, red and green onions to potatoes, mix gently. Add dressing; toss to coat. Top with bacon and Parmesan cheese just before serving.

On 10-27, a Thinking of You card was sent to **Margaret Davies**, following her husband's surgery.


On 11-15, a Thinking of You card was sent to **Renate Goldsmith** following her husband's illness and surgery.
