Proposed By-law Amendment.

A brief summation of the regrettable need for an amendment to the Compass Club Bylaws was given by President Shari Russell at the October Luncheon. She stated that many agencies, non-profits, businesses and other organizations throughout the country have had to adopt Codes of Conduct to protect members and guests from gossip & ill will. These organizations point to the misunderstandings, ill will, hurt feelings and bullying via speech and social media when the normal civil expectations of good behavior aren't addressed. The Spokesman Review recently reported on a Seattle court case which resulted in the perpetrators being fired. The firing was upheld by the courts as cyberspace bullying even though specific names weren't given, just the circumstances which allowed for the public to question and connect the dots.

Our own dear Compass Club has been wracked with this very public issue which has resulted in hurt feelings, bullying and ill will. Unfortunately most of the club members appear to be very aware of & troubled by these behaviors. Therefore the current Board tackled this hostile issue immediately after their installation this summer. Many people were interviewed, there were discussions and research into local Codes of Conduct from school districts to local businesses. Outside professional sources were contacted to review the 10 page discussion paper that summarized specific events and the issues the Club faced.

The entire Board agreed to a one page outline that summarized the issues. It stated in part that to remain in our elected board positions, we would follow codes of conduct of professionalism and friendship, taking the lead in re-establishing civil and moral behaviors.

Compass Club's mission is one of FRIENDSHIP! Destructive behaviors are not welcome in our club. Your Board has actively worked to overcome and heal this club. The last piece of putting our club back to its wonderful self is to add an Amendment to the By-laws to address specifically the Codes of Conduct expected of club members and guests. Here then is our proposal which will be voted on at the November Luncheon. If you have any comments, concerns or feedback, please email or contact Shari Russell. PROPOSAL.

Our mission and object is to promote friendship. Harassment and/or bullying of members by others cannot be tolerated. This not only pertains to gossip, second hand information being passed but also includes cyber bullying and unkind verbiage passed on Facebook, Twitter, Blogs and Tweets. These are the prominent, public social media venues in 2015 and future social media venues are included in this by-law. The content of the cyber space posts that are in question do not have to 'name names, situations or thoughts' in order to be considered harassment.

Members that are found to be in violation of this by-law will be reviewed by the Board. If deemed appropriate, the member in question will have her membership terminated.

This amendment will be located under Article III Membership, Section D. Duties of Members. Identified as number 4.
