At our June luncheon our annual survey was completed by our members. Here are the results!! We heard from 52 members and after the tabulations this is what we found:

Several members volunteered to assist as a luncheon greeter or helping check in and auction committee. There were several volunteers who did not sign their names.

The luncheon locations that were the most popular are Marabeau, Hemmingson, Barrister, Beacon Hill, High County, Cedars, and the Convention Center. There were several people who have a preference for downtown locations.

There were great suggestions for new venues and programs. Mostly, it seems the members are very happy with the entertainment and speakers

The top dollar our members are willing to pay for a luncheon ranges from \$20 to \$25. There were two surveys that said they would go as high as \$30.00. The survey also indicated that either table service or buffet was acceptable. It seemed the most popular item for a luncheon was salad or chicken. There were three members that would like a gluten free option.

This year March included a luncheon and an evening event at Patsy Clarks with piano entertainment. The survey indicated that 22 members would like a repeat of this event. Generally speaking the surveys were all very positive and show that our membership is happy with how the board is running the club.


