You may come for the full day or part of it. We send someone out to pick up lunch for us, or you can bring your own. We are able to use all of the supplies on hand or may purchase anything we need.

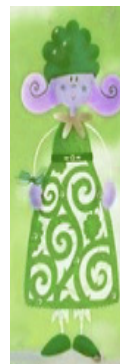
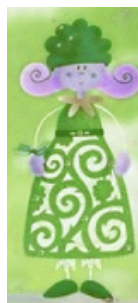
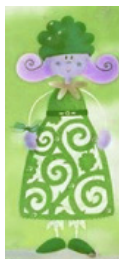

There were no reports from interest groups and there was no old business.

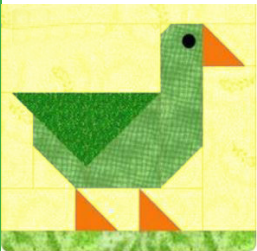
The 50/50 drawing was held and \$56.50 was won by a new member.

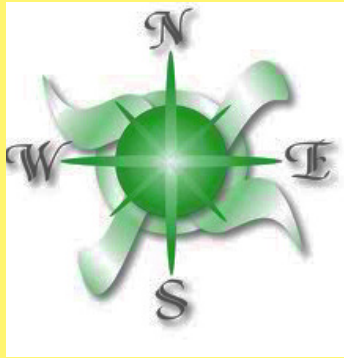
