I am so proud that a Swedish immigrant by the name of Otto Frederick Gideon Sundbäck advanced the technology and developed the zipper in 1913 as we know it today. It was not until 1930 that it was commonly used in clothing.

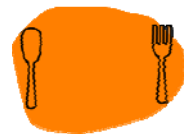

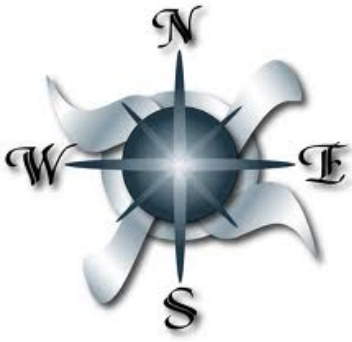
