## FROM OUR PRESIDENT

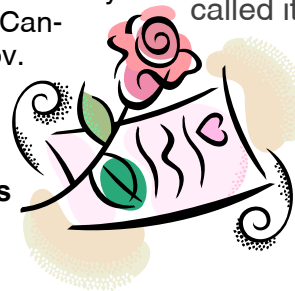
Dear Friends,

As this year draws to an end I am so thankful to be a part of Compass Club, we are all unique and have different beliefs and ideas, but somehow we all come together and make this club of ours a huge success. Happy Thanksgiving to you all. ♥

On December 10th the Nobel prizes will be awarded in the Blue Room at the Cityhall in Stockholm. Alfred Nobel patented his invention in 1867 and he called it Dynamite. In 1888 Al-

freds brother Rudvig passed away while visiting France, a newspaper erroneously published Alfreds name and called him "Le Marchand de la

mort" (The merchant of death). Disappointed with how he might be remembered, he set aside 94% of his estate to establish the Nobel Prize, to honor Men and Women for their achievements in Physics, Chemistry, Medicine and Literature. Dr. Nobel "I intend to leave after my death a large fund for the promotion of peace" "But I am skeptical as to its result." The first Peace prize was awarded in Oslo to Henry Dunant the founder of Red

We will be meeting on the 1st Monday and 3rd Tuesday of each month around 9am (8am when it is hot).



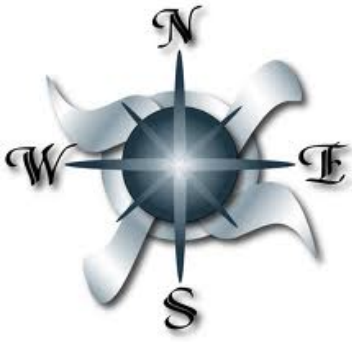
This is a great way to get better acquainted with other club members. Please contact me if you would like to join us. I send out an email 2 or 3 days prior to the walk with the location and time.
