On December 10th the Nobel prizes will be awarded in the Blue Room at the Cityhall in Stockholm. Alfred Nobel patented his invention in 1867 and he called it Dynamite. In 1888 AIfreds brother Rudvig passed away while visiting France, a newspaper erroneously published Alfreds name and called him "Le Marchand de la mort" (The merchant of death). Disappointed with how he might be remembered, he set aside 94\% of his estate to establish the Nobel Prize, to honor Men and Women for their achievements in Physics, Chemistry, Medicine and Literature. Dr. Nobel "I intend to leave after my death a large fund for the promotion of peace" "But I am skeptical as to its result." The first Peace prize was awarded in Oslo to Henry Dunant the founder of Red
