son it seemed appropriate to talk about the safety match.

This past holiday I bet we all used a lot of matches to light candles, a fire in the fire place

just to make a cozy atmosphere. I did not know matches had been around since the year 1670. At that time they were made with yellow

phosphor that was very toxic and could self ignite causing fires. The safety match was invented in 1844 in Sweden by Gustaf Eric Pasch. Mr. Pasch was working as an apprentice for a chemist who thought red phosphor might be an alternative to the yellow phosphor as it was not toxic, Mr. Pasch worked on that concept and the Swedish safety match became famous all over the world.

Joshua Pusey from Pennsylvania invented the matchbook with a striking surface on the

inside cover. The Diamond Match Company bought Pusey's patent and moved the striking surface to the outside. In 1896 a company ordered fifty thousand matchbooks to advertise a new product and

the unique way of advertising was born. In the 1940's the psychological warfare branch of the US. government distributed thousands of matchbooks con-

taining anti-nazi slogans to occupied countries, and the French Resistance produced matchbooks containing instructions on how to derail Nazi trains printed on the inside cover.

Today billions of matches are used every day all over the world.

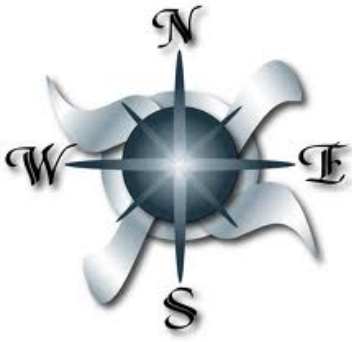
