before we know it we'll be wishing for relief from the heat.

The three-point seatbelt was introduced in Volvo cars in 1959. Nils Bohlin a Swedish safety engineer had worked with more elaborate four-point harnesses in airplanes, and designed ejector seats for Saab fighter airplanes. In designing the new seat belt, he concentrated on providing a more effective method of protecting driver and passenger against the impact when a car crashed. The new belt secured both the upper and lower body, its straps joined at hip level. Mr. Bohlin said "It was just a matter of finding a

tive and could be put on conveniently with one hand".

In the interest of safety, Volvo made the new seat design available to other car manufacturers for free; it was required on all American vehicles from 1968 onward. Volvo estimated the belt had saved more than one million lives since it was introduced, here

in the USA seat belts save more than 11,000 lives each year.


