before they met, attended to him during his visits to Dr. Klein and she soon developed a friendship with the star. She would later volunteer to bear Jackson's child; soon, she became pregnant and three months before the birth of their son in 1996, they got married. They eventually had a daughter as well. At their divorce in 1999, she gave up all parental rights making Jackson the sole custodial parent of their two children. After Jackson's death, she gained supervised visitation rights to see her children again. As a side note, Deborah received \$8.5 million in settlement from their divorce.

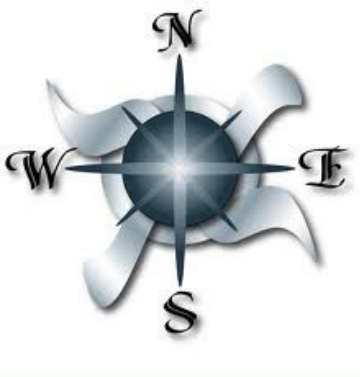
Meetings are the 3rd Monday each month at 1:00 at the Dance Hall.
