Although the concept of dental implants has been around for thousands of years, in 1952 Per-Ingvar Brånemark, a Swedish physician and researcher, who was using a titanium implant chamber to study blood flow in rabbit bone, accidentally discovering osseointegration between

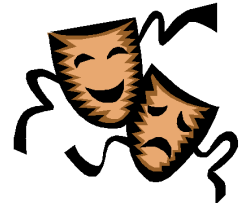

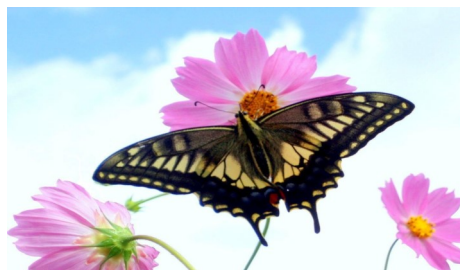
## SCRAPPIN' & CRAFTIN'

titanium and animal bones. Brånemark continued his studies and, in 1965, had his first volunteer for dental implants. Dr. Brånemark was ridiculed for nearly 30 years by dentists and scientists until the year 1982 at a conference held in Toronto where the global scientific community finally accepted his research. Using titanium implants has since become the most accepted form of dental implant available.

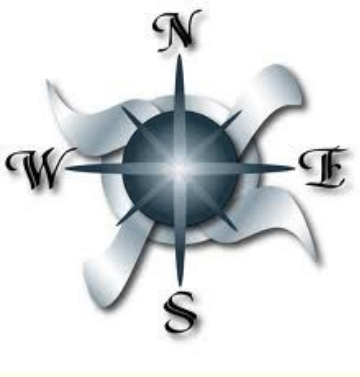

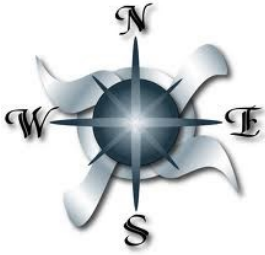

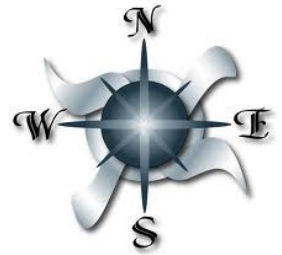
