## Wine Tasting

Late autumn and early winter bring my favorite holidays. Our November wine tasting typically included wines that go well with Thanksgiving dinners. Since we can't get together as a group, I thought that I would share some recommendations from publications like Food \& Wine and Better Homes \& Gardens.

A dry sparkling wine makes a great starter, which includes some wonderful selections from Washington and California. You can also look abroad to French Champagne, Italian Prosecco or Spanish Cava. For the main event consider crisp, fruity white wines such as Sauvignon Blanc, Riesling, Viognier, Chenin Blanc and Gewurztraminer. Lighter-bodied red wines with moderate acidity also work
well: Pinot Noir (Oregon is known for its Pinots), Gamay or Cru Beaujolais, Syrah/ Shiraz and Zinfandel. Rose' isn't just for summer
 and can be a refreshing complement to heavy dishes, too.

Local wine stores such as Vino! A Wine Shop and Total Wine would be happy to assist you in selecting wines for your special meal. There are also a lot of resources online by just searching for "Thanksgiving wines".
