### Wine Tasting

#### **Happy New Year!**

If there was ever a year to celebrate its conclusion, I think most would agree that it would be this one. What's a better way to celebrate than with a glass of sparkling wine like Champagne? Maybe two glasses... Only sparkling wine grown and handpicked in the Champagne region of France can truly be called Champagne. Other cool regions, however, can also produce excellent sparkling wines. Other areas which produce notable sparkling wine include northeast Italy (prosecco), select regions of Spain (cava) and other regions of France (crémant).

Most sparkling wine in the U.S. comes from California, typically from grape varietals chardonnay and pinot noir, but Washington and Oregon are also known for some first-rate sparklers. One of these is from Chateau Ste. Michelle's winemaker, Paula Eakin, who just happens to be a native of Spokane.

Her **Domaine Ste. Michelle NV Brut Rosé, Co- lumbia Valley** was rated not only "unanimously outstanding", but also a Best Buy from *Wine Press Northwest* in 2019. Also rated "unanimously outstanding" were 2 sparklers from

the Willamette Valley, Oregon: ROCO Winery 2015 RMS Brut and Anne Amie Vineyards 2017 Cuveé A Amrita Sparkling White Wine. For other outstanding Northwest selections, please check out their article online.

The wine group will not meet again until restrictions permit us gathering together. So, until then, maybe on New Year's Eve we should heed the words from this respected actress...

The golf group is planning to play **Virtual Golf** on Tuesday afternoons at Esmeralda GC once they have it set up.


