Greetings! We're about halfway through January already and heading into February, the month to celebrate love. Here are a few fun facts about Valentine's Day:

- 1. February 14th is the second largest card giving day of the year, just after Christmas. An estimated 145 million Valentine's Day cards are sent each year. Teachers receive the most Valentine's Day cards, followed by children, mothers, wives and pets. Americans probably began exchanging hand-made valentines in the early 1700s. In the 1840s, Esther A. Howland began selling the first mass-produced valentines in America.
- Every year, more than 36 million heart-shaped boxes of chocolates are sold across the country.
- 3. Most roses sold on Valentine's
  Day in the U.S. are imported
  from South America, mainly Ecuador. Roses grow perfectly
  straight only near the equator
  where the sun shines perpendicular to the plant. The high altitude, closeness to the Equator

## Wine Tasting

Who doesn't like chocolate? And if you're in the wine group, I already know that you love wine. Do you ever enjoy them together? If not, there is no better time than Valentine's Day to pair them together. Really, any day is a good day to combine the two! I checked out simplychocolate.com and Eataly.com for some pointers on selecting chocolate to go with your favorite wine.

If you enjoy sweeter chocolate, select a sweeter wine. An example is to pair white chocolate with a white like Riesling or Moscato d'Asti or a sweet Rosé. Intensity matters, too. A lightly flavored chocolate should be enjoyed with lighter wines and more intense chocolates with full-bodied wines. Dark chocolates that are 50 to 100% cacao have intense

flavors which should be savored with full-bodied, yet fruit-forward wines such as Zinfandel, Shiraz, Merlot, Grenache and vintage Port. Milk chocolate is the easiest to pair and can accompany a light to medium-bodied

wine like a Pinot Noir, Petite Sirah or Sherry. Personal taste is always the deciding factor where food and wine are concerned. Why not experiment and decide for yourself what works?

Until we can gather together again, "Wine a little, laugh a lot."
