Regional wineries: Spring Valley (Walla Walla) and their red blends Uriah and Frederick; Dunham (Walla Walla) and their Shirley Mays Chardonnay and Lew-



is Vineyard Syrah; Col Solare (Benton City) and their Cabernet Sauvignon; Guardian Cellars (Columbia Valley) The Informant Syrah-Viognier; Reininger (Walla Walla).

Other wineries: Beaulieu Vineyard (CA) and their red blend Tapestry; Elouan (CA) and their Pinot Noir made from Oregon grapes.

Besides wineries, other favorite retailers mentioned were: Vino! A Wine Shop, Costco and Total Wine & More.
