5) U.S.: 352 awards (10%)

4) Portugal: 447

popular fortified wine from there.
3) Italy: 512 awards. Many of you
are familiar with Chianti
(sangiovese). Other notable reds
include Vino Nobile di Montepulciano and Brunello di Montalcino.
2) Spain: 794 awards. Enjoy a red
wine from Rioja or Ribera del

Duero, both predominantly from

1) France: 851 awards. France has legendary wine regions like Bordeaux which produces red wines typically with cabernet sauvignon, merlot and cabernet franc and white wine from sauvignon blanc. Burgundy also makes wonderful red and white wines and who hasn't heard of Champagne?
