Embrace Washington is committed to providing, care and supporting children in foster care within our community. They do this by raising awareness of vulnerable chil-



dren's needs, identifying how to meet those needs by connecting individuals and organizations with a heart to serve the foster care community. Daily we strive to eliminate any roadblocks that foster parents face to provide a normal happy life for a child in foster care.

These roadblocks could be a variety of things such as: providing a foster child a new bed, educational support, paying for summer camp, music or sports and educational support are just to name a few. Activities for foster children and their families build healthy memories and experiences which allow kids to feel loved and stable in an uncertain time in their lives. Maddie's Place was inspired in 2008, when a three-week old baby girl was delivered to the doorstep of the Hughes family in Spokane, Washington. With eight years of experience as a foster and adoptive mom of drug affected babies, Tricia Hughes knew immediately that something wasn't right. Spokane was just beginning to see an increase in babies withdrawing from opiates, and that was exactly what was happening to this baby girl. For six long

months, her body was ravaged with the symptoms of withdrawal. During this time, she needed constant care and comfort, and she rarely left Tricia's arms. As Tricia became more aware of the overwhelming numbers of substance-exposed newborns in Spokane, she tried to convince her husband, Carey, that ALL of these babies need-

ed this same attentive care from loving arms if they were ever going to thrive. Maddie's Place was born.

Maddie's Place is a 501(c)3 non-profit, freestanding recovery nursery for babies experiencing withdrawal due to prenatal substance



exposure. We firmly believe that low-intervention, highly nurturing care is the best way to help babies through this difficult time. We also believe that "mom is the best medicine," and aim to support moms and babies together, encouraging bonding and attachment and alleviating physical symptoms. Teen and Kids Closet is all about dignity for an oftenoverlooked population, children in need. The idea is simple. We give new or gently used clothing to children who need it for free. Our focus is youth in foster care or in poverty. Most of the youth we serve have no other access to nice clothes. Teen and Kid Closet is all about dignity for

an often-overlooked population, children in need. The organization was founded in 2007 and serves children from birth to 22 years. They give children choices when so often, they have none. They take donations of new or

gently used clothes and place them in their store at 307 E Sprague. Then the children and their families come to the store and shop. Monetary donations are used to obtain other needed items. More than 120 children shop each month at the store. For more information visit Teenkidcloset.org
