## Philanthropy Project 2023-2024

Hope everyone had a wonderful summer and are looking forward to starting Compass Club activities again. Thanks to your great generosity last year we were able to present Big Table with a check for $\$ 1,600$ last June. Thank you again for your great support of Compass Clubs Philanthropy project for 2022/2023.

This year's Philanthropy project will be Maddie's Place. Maddie's Place was inspired in 2008, when a three-week old baby girl was delivered to the doorstep of the Hughes family in Spokane, Washington. With eight years of experience as a foster and adoptive mom of drug affected babies, Tricia Huges knew immediately that something wasn't right. Spokane was just beginning to see an increase in babies withdrawing from opiates, and that was exactly what was happening to this baby girl. For six long months, her body was ravaged with the symptoms of withdrawal. During this time, she needed constant care and comfort, and she rarely left Tricia's arms.

As Tricia became more aware of the overwhelming numbers of substance-exposed newborns in Spokane, she tried to convince her husband, Carey, that ALL of these babies needed this same attentive care from loving arms if they were ever going to thrive. Maddie's Place was born.

Maddie's Place is a 501(c)3 non-profit, free-standing recovery nursery for babies experiencing withdrawal due to prenatal substance exposure. We firmly believe that low-intervention, highly nurturing care is the best way to help babies through this difficult time. We also believe that "mom is the best medicine," and aim to support moms and babies together, encouraging bonding and attachment and alleviating physical symptoms.
