Philanthropy Project 2023-2024

Our October luncheon included a presentation from Maddie's Place. Our speakers were Kim Dunham, Director of Family Advocacy and Katie Bunch-Smith, Peer Support. Maddie's Place is a 501(c)3 non-

profit, free-standing recovery nursery for babies experiencing withdrawal due to prenatal substance exposure. Maddie's Place will take babies that are born addicted from the hospital as soon as they are medically stable.



This usually will happen a few days after birth. If the baby were left in the hospital they would be transferred to a Neonatal Unit where they are given drugs and have very little human contact during withdrawals.

The goal of Maddie's Place is to help the babies get through withdrawals without medication. This is done with cuddling and a lot of human contact. They also have many tricks to keep the baby as controllable as possible during the withdrawal process. Maddie's place has been open for one year in Spokane. It is a unique service and there are only about 9 other similar nurseries in the United States. For more information visit https://www.maddiesplace.org


