Philanthropy

Hope everyone had a wonderful holiday season and are enjoying the New Year. As you are most likely aware, this year's Philanthropy Project is Maddie's Place, a charity devoted to caring for newborns who are born addicted to drugs.

"Nearly 15% of live births across our country have a prenatal course that involves substance use, and this is likely an underestimate. Eighty to ninety percent of infants born exposed to substances will show symptoms of withdrawal and/or neuro-behavioral changes that interfere with the basic functions of eating, sleeping, communicating cues and connecting with a caregiver. Withdrawal symptoms typically appear between day 2 and day 6 of life, peak around 2

weeks of age, and can persist for 4
-6 months. Even when symptoms do begin to fade, there are lasting effects and risks as these children grow. Supporting early connections and providing nurturing comfort from the beginning results in a hap-



pier, healthier baby and a more stable attachment, which changes the trajectory of lives." (information from supplies from https://www.maddiesplace.org.) Maddie's Place is a free standing Neonatal Nursery that supplies the nurturing comfort that can change these infants' lives for the better.

I was born in Oak Harbor on Whidbey Island Washington. After high school, I joined the Air Force. At that time (1973), the Air Force was pushing women into male-dominated careers. I thought I would be testing fuels in aircraft, but instead I worked on the fuel systems themselves. Women were allowed to repair plane systems but not fly them. After a couple of years, I realized that that was not what I wanted to do. Since I was not allowed to fly aircraft and I did not like working on them, I decided "I'll tell them where to go!" So, I cross trained as an air traffic controller. I met my husband, Larry, a fellow air traffic controller, in the Air Force. We married and had a three-week honeymoon in Egypt. Some years later, we came to Spokane in 1995 for Larry's job.

In my spare time, I like to read, travel, attend the theatre and movies, and garden (aka pull weeds).

A major accomplishment in my life was serving in the US Air Force for 12 years. I am a Vietnam War veteran and so is my husband. We have visited dozens of other countries including the Cook Islands, Africa, and Antarctica. I lived in the United Kingdom (England) for seven years while on active duty. After arriving in Spokane, I became a Tour Director for 10 years, where I had the opportunity to be an instructor for adults in history, flora/fauna, culture, wildlife, geology, etc. I've met many fascinating people along the way.


