


# Crafting & Chatting

I would like to extend a special thanks to **Anne Slauson** for the lovely Valentine items she sewed and had for sale at our February meeting. All the

proceeds have been donated to the Philanthropy Project "Maddie's Place". I know the money will be put to good use to help Maddie's babies. We also held our raffle which was won by **Ann Fly**.



"The babies at Maddie's Place have been "exposed to in-utero to drugs ranging from methamphetamine to legal antidepressants, but the vast majority — more than 80% — of the 64 babies who've received care at Maddie's Place have been addicted to opioids, most often fentanyl. Opened in October 2022, Maddie's Place uniquely allows a parent (the mother or father, but not both) to live at the facility with free room and board while their infant is taken care of and assessed by medical staff." Hamachi Crudo: Sliced Hamachi (yellowtail tuna) sauced with a lemon yuzu soy sauce Garnished with finely chopped red onions, cilantro, and lemon zest

Hamachi Nigiri: Sliced Hamachi (yellowtail tuna) on seasoned rice. Hamachi is seared and brushed with Nikiri (house made sweet soy sauce). Garnished with tobiko
