Christian feast day in the early 17th century and is observed by the Catholic Church, the Anglican Communion, the Eastern Orthodox Church, and the Lutheran Church. Even though folklore credits Saint Patrick with driving out the snakes from Ireland the day actually commemorates Saint Patrick and the arrival of Christianity in Ireland, and, by extension, celebrates the heritage and culture of the Irish in general. Celebrations generally involve public parades and festivals, céilithe, the wearing of green attire or shamrocks, and church attendance.

In the United States, the religious significance of the day has mostly been disregarded, and the day is generally an excuse to party. We love green beer and corned beef and cabbage. The saying is everyone's Irish on Saint Patrick's Day. However you decide to celebrate, have a good time and be safe.


The Ukulele Group meets on the 3rd Tuesday of each month at 1 pm to practice and learn new songs. The meetings are at Kathi Brandmueller's.


