- 1. **Camp Rooted** ~ https://www.camprooted.org ~ "provides a week of camp where siblings that are separated in the foster care system can come together. We help them experience the healthy power of laughter and play as they create positive memories together that remind them of the lasting bond that they share and deserve to cherish."
- 2. Safety Net ~ https://safetynetinlandnw.org ~ "is the helping hand for our local teens and young adults who have aged out of the foster care system. That means helping them with the resources to stay in school, build self esteem, receive job training and handle financial emergencies when they have nowhere else to turn."
- 3. **Transitions** ~ help4women.org ~ works to end poverty and homelessness for women and children in Spokane. "We operate six programs [including Woman's Hearth and Miryam's House] designed to support our community by providing childcare, housing, job training and friendly, safe spaces for women and children."

If you asked that a charity be considered, and it was not chosen by the board, please don't give up! Consider re-submitting next year.
